- 3. Break-out Small Group Activity by College Recruitment Strategies
 - a. Group 1 (Eric Oslund, reporter) not good coordination between marketing and PR and departments/chairs; need better social media; need better understanding of what MTSU's identity is
 - b. Group 2 (Brandon Wallace, reporter) originally thought we need to make contacts with counselors in schools, but those folks are often overwhelmed and incredibly busy; instead, find clubs and organizations with the high schools
 - c. Group 3 (Billy Pittard, reporter) strong emphasis on the importance of website presence; LinkedIn group; EAB newsletters and focus on recruiting; Students today = stealth students (according to Deb Sells), so keep MTSU web pages up to

date; social media presence; competition for media arts; virtual tour; community colleges are just as important as high schools

- d. Group 4 (Ron Henderson, reporter) get students on campus; chemistry department 300 students on campus during the week; Blackman Academy (should have been every high school in the county) two hours on campus (informative and fun)
